NARRATIVES OF HIV: HEARING THEIR STORIES



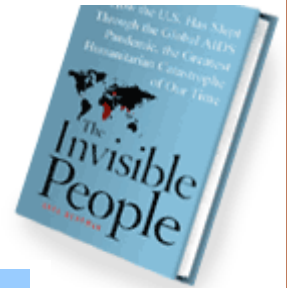
Monday, January 24th, 7 pm

Monday, January 31st, 7 pm

Greg Behrman, author of "*The Invisible People: How the U.S. Has Slept Through the Global AIDS Pandemic, the Greatest Humanitarian Catastrophe of Our Time*" (Free Press, 2004): the first journalistic history of U.S. policy towards global HIV/AIDS.

All proceeds from the sale of Mr. Behrman's book go towards **Heartbeat**, an international non-profit supporting children orphaned and made vulnerable by HIV/AIDS in South Africa



Wednesday, February 2nd, 7 pm

Scenarios from Africa: Dr. Kate Winskell from Emory University will speak about her intervention work with African youth who created short films to inspire others to prevent the transmission of HIV.

Wednesday, February 9th, 7 pm

SISTA Intervention, funded by the CDC, will be presented in honor of **Black AIDS & Awareness Day**. This gender- and culturally- relevant intervention, is designed to increase condom use with African American women. Peer-led group sessions focus on ethnic and gender pride, HIV knowledge, and skills training around sexual risk reduction behaviors and decision making. The intervention is based on Social Learning theory & the theory of Gender and Power.
